Irish Australian Chamber of Commerce officially launches Irish Chapter

The Irish Australian Chamber of Commerce will officially launch its Irish Chapter in Dublin on 1st June with a reception in the company of Chapter Patron, Dr. Ruth Adler, the Australian Ambassador to Ireland and over 150 senior business figures from a range of sectors.

Foundation Members for the new Chapter are Bank of Ireland, Commonwealth Bank of Australia, CPL, Currency Fair, Eisner Amper, Ernst & Young, Etihad Airways, Flight Centre, Fintech Ireland & Pepper Ireland.

The Chapter will be led by Peter Oakes and Vincent Crowley, both experienced senior executives with experience gained in both Australia and Ireland over many years.

Commenting on the launch, IACC President Rob Clifford, who has travelled from Australia for the launch event, said "In this 70th year of diplomatic relations between Ireland and Australia, we look forward to the possibilities that the activities of this new Chapter represents. We welcome the growing interest from Irish companies looking at Australia as their preferred base in the Asia Pacific region.
